### LIABILITIES AND OBLIGATIONS OF MEMBERSHIP:

From the Memorandum and Articles of Association of The Concrete Society: The Liability of Members is limited. Every member of the Society undertakes to contribute to the assets of the Society, in the event of the same being wound up while he/she is a Member or within one year after he/she ceases to be a Member, for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Society contracted before he/she ceases to be a Member, and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up, and for the adjustment of the right of the contributories amongst themselves, such amount as may be required not exceeding £10.

Members may withdraw from the Society by giving notice in writing at least six months before the end of any subscription year, and paying any unpaid subscription due for the current and previous years. Membership will cease at the end of the subscription year. If six months' notice is not given, Members will be liable to pay the subscription for the ensuing year as well as for the current year.
